The Lancaster City Schools Citizens Committee for Children is an informal group that wants to do what they can to pass the levy, giving today's kids the same opportunity in education that we have had in the past. The group consist of 5 members, Bill Bickham, Mina Ubbing, Steve Wels, Bob Wolfinger and Dean Cochenour. Bill and his children have been involved in the past in the levy and bond issues. Bob is a Lancaster native who in the past has not gotten involved in levy issues. The levy is valuable for the economics of Lancaster. There have been decisions in the past from the school board that have been controversial, and in the future there will be an audit independent audit committee to review what is going on with the board.
